Poverty eradication is one of the major objectives of planned development. The magnitude of the problem is still quite staggering. According to a World Bank Report, India has the most number of people who lived below the international poverty line of \$1.90 a day. Thirty six per cent of the Indian population was Below Poverty Line (BPL) in 1993-94, the latest year for which the data is available and the absolute number of poor was 320 million, out of which 244 million (37 per cent of the rural population) lived in rural areas. According to 2016 World Bank Report, 270 million are under BPL, the poverty rate is 25% in rural and 14% in urban areas in India.

Poverty alleviation and Employment Generation are the most significant goals of growth approach since the initiation of planning in India. Creation of employment and eradication of poverty are the basic services programmes have been process in few decades. Later economic reforms are in progress to eradicate poverty and employment generation. These have been ample variations across the states in rural and urban areas. The concept of sustainable economic growth, that implies progressive changes in the socio-economic formation of a country in terms of eradication of poverty and unemployment.

The importance of employment generation programmes for poverty alleviation in India are (i) Direct relationship between employment and poverty alleviation, (ii) Higher standard of living, (iii) Reduce rural-urban migration, (iv) Creation of durable assets, (v) Self-sufficiency and self-reliant areas and (vi) Impart and enhance skills.

Eradication of poverty through overall economic and social development by ensuring equitable access in resources and skills, as well as by widening the opportunities for gainful employment to the deprived sections of the society, is enunciated as the principal objective of all the rural development programmes initiated by the government.

The Ministries of the Government of India have come up with various useful schemes from time to

time. These schemes could be either central, state in specific with joint collaboration.

The central and state governments are implementing several schemes for employment generation and poverty alleviation but the impact is not up to the mark. There should be a mechanism for the evaluation of every scheme which is most important. Based on the importance of Evaluation of Employment Generation & Poverty Alleviation schemes for the development of Indian economy, this theme has been selected for organising a national seminar.
